# 2. Readings

## 1<sup>st</sup> Reading - Micah 4:1-5 (The Message translation) [SIT]

But when all is said and done, God's Temple on the mountain, Firmly fixed, will dominate all mountains, towering above surrounding hills.

People will stream to it and many nations set out for it, Saying, "Come, let's climb God's mountain. Let's go to the Temple of Jacob's God.

He will teach us how to live.
We'll know how to live God's way."
True teaching will issue from Zion,
God's revelation from Jerusalem.

He'll establish justice in the rabble of nations and settle disputes in faraway places. They'll trade in their swords for shovels, their spears for rakes and hoes. Nations will quit fighting each other, quit learning how to kill one another.

Each man will sit under his own shade tree, each woman in safety will tend her own garden. God-of-the-Angel-Armies says so, and he means what he says.

Meanwhile, all the other people live however they wish, picking and choosing their gods. But we live honouring God, and we're loyal to our God forever and ever.

#### 2nd Reading - Matthew 5:1-12 (New Living Translation)

One day as he saw the crowds gathering, Jesus went up on the mountainside and sat down. His disciples gathered around him, and he began to teach them.

God blesses those who are poor and realize their need for him, for the Kingdom of Heaven is theirs.

God blesses those who mourn, for they will be comforted.
God blesses those who are humble, for they will inherit the whole earth.
God blesses those who hunger and thirst for justice, for they will be satisfied.
God blesses those who are merciful, for they will be shown mercy.
God blesses those whose hearts are pure, for they will see God.
God blesses those who work for peace, for they will be called the children of God.
God blesses those who are persecuted for doing right, for the Kingdom of Heaven is theirs.

God blesses you when people mock you and persecute you and lie about you and say all sorts of evil things against you because you are my followers. Be happy about it! Be very glad! For a great reward awaits you in heaven. And remember, the ancient prophets were persecuted in the same way.

### 4. Prayers

We pray for people whose lives have been broken by war: for those who cry, and those who can't cry anymore; for those who are in pain, and those who feel numb; for people who are prisoners, and for those who guard them; for anyone who has lost their home or their homeland.

R: Give peace in our hearts, O Lord

We pray for those who cause trouble or stir up hate; for those who profit from the pain of others; for those who turn to harmful things to forget their pain; and for those who believe peace will never come. We also bring before you, in silence or aloud, the people and places we especially want to remember today...

#### (silence)


Hold us close, loving God, and help us to live as people of hope and peace, until the day when your peace fills the whole world.
