Posada News



More churches across the diocese — including the Cathedral — are embracing the Posada, a joyful Latin American Advent tradition where Mary and Joseph journey from home to home, reminding us to make room for Christ in our lives.

This year, four churches in the Monmouth Marches Ministry Area shared a travelling Posada, and it proved a wonderful way to draw the communities together.

After a launch service led by Revd Liz and Archdeacon Ian, Mary, Joseph and their much loved “wonky donkey” began their Advent travels. They stayed in homes across Llanishen, Trelleck Grange, Llanfihangel Tor y Mynydd and Llansoy, and even continued their adventures between Boxing Day and Epiphany.

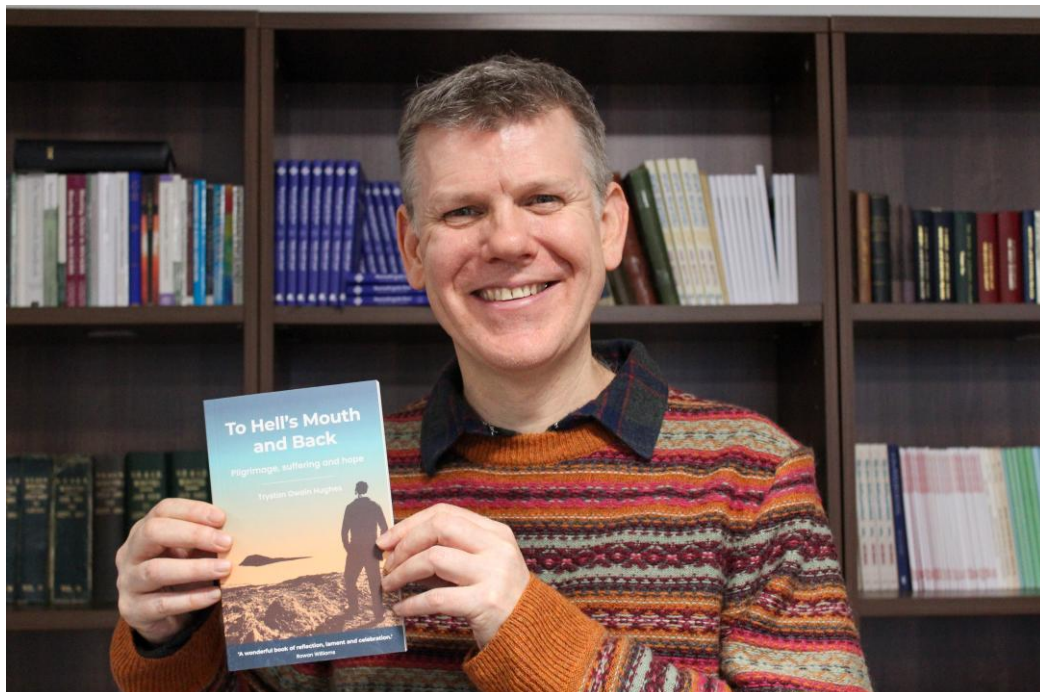
Their itinerary was delightfully eclectic: school, Scouts, art groups, Bristol Airport, a dance in Bristol, and even a visit to a dentist who checked their teeth and gave them a spin in his chair. There were tender moments too, including offering comfort during the final night of a man who passed away the next day.

The Posada also made it to every Carol Service — in churches and pubs — the Family Crib Service, Midnight Mass, and both Christmas Day celebrations. On Boxing Day they joined a family gathering where Joseph attempted the saxophone and Mary played the glockenspiel with great grandchildren providing enthusiastic accompaniment.

Their post Christmas travels included birthday parties and a meeting with the Mari Lwyd before returning to Llanishen for Epiphany. The service opened with Daniel de Souza's recording of Three Kings from Persian Lands Afar, followed by We Three Kings, with each king carried to the crib in turn. Llansoy held a similar celebration shortly afterwards, bringing the Posada journey to a close.

There's already talk of doing it all again next year — and after such a joyful adventure, who could resist?

Lent book focuses on finding hope in our lives



Finding hope in our journeys is the theme of a compelling new volume that has been chosen by the Archbishop of Wales as her 2026 Lent Book.

In the book, Trystan Owain Hughes reflects on his own experience of suffering and how he clung to hope through both a gruelling 140-mile pilgrimage and a

second ‘pilgrimage’ through a long recovery from a serious back injury. For Trystan, pilgrimages are journeys that share certain core elements and when we recognise these elements in our own lives, whether we’re navigating grief, faith, work, education or illness, we come to understand ourselves more deeply and discover God’s light breaking through in the places we least expect.

The book, which is published in both English and Welsh, includes a concise study guide designed to stimulate deeper reflection and to lead people through Lent. The season of Lent, which this year begins on **February 18**, is the six-week period leading up to Easter and is traditionally a time of reflection.

The book has already received praise, from many senior figures in the Christian world, including Rowan Williams (former Archbishop of Canterbury), Rob Parsons OBE, and Professor Dee Dyas (Director of the UK Centre for Pilgrimage Studies).

The author, Rev Dr Trystan Owain Hughes, is Director of Ministry Development in the Church in Wales, advising the Welsh bishops on matters of ministry and faith, and Canon Emeritus at Llandaff Cathedral. Trystan’s aim in the book, he says, is to inspire people to find hope in their lives in the run-up to Easter.

“In *To Hell’s Mouth and Back* I want to inspire readers to find hope and joy in every part of their lives – in moments of quiet, in walks in the countryside or in a local park, in time spent with family or friends, or in work or hobbies,” says Trystan.

“In the book, I explore both the suffering and the unexpected joys of my own transformative journeys. Through this, my hope is that something of my story might resonate with other people’s and will encourage them to keep walking their paths with faith, courage and, above all, hope.”

“It’s time we move Lent away from simply being a time to ‘give up’ things to being a time to ‘open up’ the journeys in our lives to God’s peace, hope, joy, and compassion.”

In endorsing the book as her official Lent Book, the Archbishop of Wales, Cherry Vann, said: “Weaving together his experience of walking an ancient pilgrim’s way in his beloved North Wales and his experience of serious injury, Trystan Owain Hughes describes in this compelling book how we can learn to see God at work in our lives, even in the darkest of times. Through vivid narrative and honest reflection, peppered with references to poetry and novels as well as scripture, he draws us to reflect on our own journeys and pilgrimages, both seen and unseen. With questions for reflection at the end of each chapter, this is a wonderful and enriching book for both individuals and study groups to engage with and I am delighted to recommend it as a Lenten read”.

It is Trystan’s seventh published book. In 2010 his book *Finding Hope and Meaning in Suffering* (SPCK) was chosen as the Archbishop of Wales’s Lent Book, and in 2020 his book, *Opening our Lives* was the official BRF Lent Book and was also chosen as the Archbishop of Wales’s Lent Book.

The [Choral Evensong Trust](#) is pleased to announce that applications for its **2026 Patronal Festival Grants** is **open now** and will remain open **until Monday 2 February 2026**, Candlemas.



These grants – made possible through the generosity of many patrons, including HM The King – support parish churches in celebrating their patronal festival (the feast day of the church's patron saint, or the nearest Sunday) through a service of choral evensong as a central feature of the festival, followed by a reception.

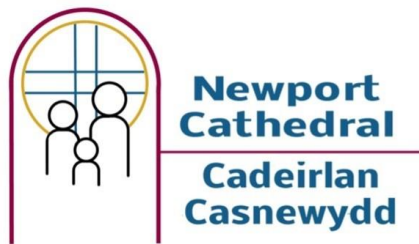
When can applications be submitted?
